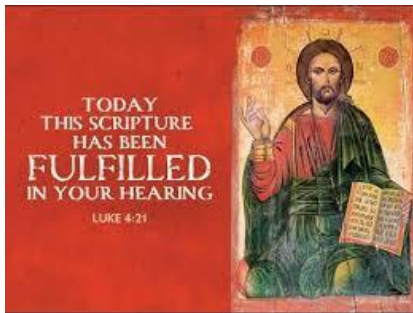

Then Jesus, filled with the power of the Spirit, returned to Galilee, and a report about him spread through all the surrounding country. He began to teach in their synagogues and was praised by everyone. When he came to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, he went to the synagogue on the sabbath day, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was given to him. He unrolled the scroll and found the place where it was written: 'The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour.' And he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant, and sat down. The eyes of all in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to say to them, 'Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing.'

Developing Rights of Peasants in the Global South

We often take for granted the variety and abundance of food in Canadian stores. Most of us are unaware that 70-80% of our food is gathered or farmed by peasants in the global south. Peasants and rural communities are being threatened. Think of land grabbing, resource theft and the contamination of soil, air and water by private Canadian corporations. How can you cultivate your land when mining or oil companies set up nearby polluting the environment and trampling on your rights?

Peace and Development have been mobilizing with peasants so that they can live with dignity and have their rights respected. The rights to land, water, health, clean environment, food sovereignty and education.

To guarantee respect for the rights of peasant and rural communities in the Global South, we call on Canada to adopt strong mandatory human rights and environmental due diligence legislation so that no Canadian companies can commit such violations. Such a law would require Canadian companies to prevent, report and remedy human rights and environmental abuses across global supply chains, and give victims access to such justice in Canadian courts.

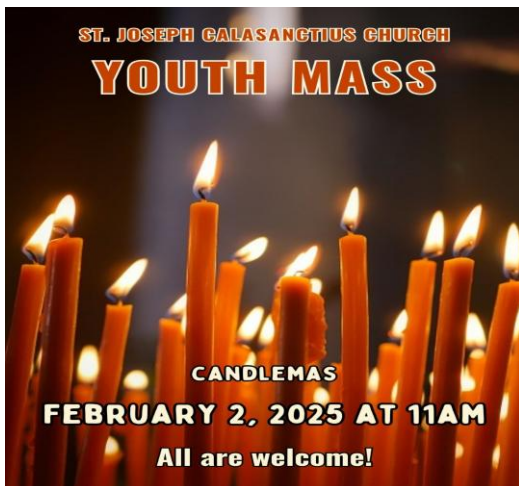
FOOD DRIVE
